Not since the 1980s has the Castle been approved for commercial use

Transforming the Castle into a vibrant public space is a key step in shaping a unique opportunity for our community. However, bringing this vision to life required overcoming several land use challenges. One crucial issue involved splitting the parcel we were purchasing from a larger property. The 2.5 acres we are acquiring, including the original wood frame ranch house, a utility block building, and the Castle, will provide space for essential elements like snow storage and parking and allow for the creation of beautiful gardens. Additionally, we had to change the property's zoning from residential to commercial and mixed-use to enable us to host events.

Over the past year, we have met with Gunnison County Planner Hillary Seminick and her team. We were fortunate to have the support of Michael Kraatz, Jerry Burgess, and Matt Hutson of SGM Engineering, along with Jody Reeser of J Reeser Architect, who guided us through the process on behalf of Hartman Castle. The county has approved our application for a land use change and setback variance, allowing the project to move forward from a permitting standpoint.

A huge thank you goes out to our volunteers; and to Hillary Seminick and her staff, the Gunnison County Planning Commission, and the Gunnison County Board of Adjustments.
